# THE DALLAS OPERA PRESENTS GARDEN SERENADES A SERIES OF FREE COMMUNITY CONCERTS IN APRIL AND MAY

# Series Offers Five Chamber Music Concerts in Partnership with Other Dallas Arts Organizations

DALLAS—<u>The Dallas Opera</u> (TDO) continues to bring live presentations back to the Greater Dallas area this spring with a collection of free chamber music concerts at community and arts partner sites throughout April and May.

*Garden Serenades* is a series of four weekend chamber music programs, performed by members of The Dallas Opera Orchestra. Concerts featuring small ensembles of string and brass players will take place at the Dallas Museum of Art (April 10 & 11), Annette Strauss Square, as part of the Dallas Arts District Changing Perspectives Block Party that spotlights Dallas arts groups (April 16), Klyde Warren Park (April 17 & 18), the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens (April 24 & 25), and Nasher Sculpture Center (May 1 & 2). Programs are approximately 40 minutes in length and are performed twice each day with a break in between performances.

"The Dallas Opera is delighted to announce this spring's free events with our Arts District and community partners featuring members of The Dallas Opera Orchestra," said Ian Derrer, The Dallas Opera's Kern Wildenthal General Director and CEO. "Offering live music to engage with audiences beyond the opera house is critical to our mission, and these concerts will not only serve to celebrate our partnerships with other local arts institutions, but to feature members of our Orchestra, who, while always heard, aren't typically seen center stage."

All venues will follow the CDC's guidelines for health and safety including recommended guidelines for social distancing outdoors.

Earlier this year, TDO announced its three-event "Welcome Back" Song Series in the Winspear Opera House commencing March 31, marking the company's first live performances since February 2020 when the pandemic forced the cancellation of in-person events.
