





YOU ENRICH STUDENTS THROUGH THE POWER OF OPERA!

As students have been forced to adapt to the challenges of the coronavirus pandemic, a real need emerged for quality arts programming that can be delivered safely.

This past year, TDO's Education Team offered free, safe, and accessible opera programs through the Education Portal—an online platform where students, teachers, and families can register for virtual and interactive programming.

Thanks to your support, more than 988 students and teachers have experienced virtual TDO education programs like **Opera Sketch Workshop** and **Kids Opera Boot Camp**. One such student from the xPlore! afterschool program at MST Magnet participated in Opera Sketch

Workshop. Through enriching lessons in music, storytelling, and visual arts, he learned first-hand about the creativity and teamwork necessary for the field—creating and presenting a scene for his fellow students.

After the program, his teacher excitedly reported that this student, who was otherwise withdrawn and quiet, was eager to take part in the activity! He even requested to stay later in the afternoon to participate.

Kristian Roberts, TDO Director of Education, states, "Despite

the challenging circumstances we have been facing, many of our education programs are now accessible to everyone through the online TDO Education Portal. Students and teachers who have limited accessibility can now utilize the learning materials at any time. Some schools have also begun integrating portions of our virtual programs into their classrooms. And now, with the help of technology and virtual spaces, we are able to serve students, not only in the DFW area, but also nationally and internationally."





TO DELIVER NEW, REIMAGINED OPERA PROGRAMMING

Amidst spring cancellations last year, TDO took a calculated risk to forge ahead with presenting reworked mainstage productions. Unfortunately, the extreme and ongoing COVID-19 concerns forced The Dallas Opera to cancel these planned March and April 2021 subscription performances. In order to move forward, TDO programming must once again pivot.

Your support is needed now more than ever to help safely provide live and digital programming. Plans are underway to bring opera to you this spring and fall with socially-distanced, live concerts and intimate recitals. In addition to still bringing the music you love back to the Winspear Opera House, TDO will be able to expand on its mission of accessibility by delivering performances to communities throughout Dallas. New digital content is also in the works so that audiences world-wide can enjoy unique and inspiring programs in the comfort of their homes.
