## MUSIC: The Characters

### Students will

### Getting Ready

Print copies of the information sheet "The Characters" and the Activity Worksheet for each student. Decide which section(s) of the worksheet you wish your group to complete. Gather pens, pencils, and additional writing paper as needed for your group.

### Introduction

Have your students read "The Story of the Opera" and " Our Composer, Rachel." Give each student a copy of the information sheet "The Characters" or display it on a screen. Read through the information, discussing each character and listening to the online selections as you go.

### Guided/Independent Practice

Depending on the grade level, the ability of your students, and time constraints, you may choose to have students work as a whole class, in small groups, with a partner, or individually. Read the directions on the Activity Worksheet. Have students complete the portion(s) of the Activity Worksheet you have chosen with opportunity for questions. If students are working with a partner or

in small groups, give them time to discuss their answers before writing them down. Have students share their answers individually, or by groups, and explain why they gave their answers.

### **Evaluation**

Have students discuss and evaluate the answers of others. After individual or small group responses have been shared and/or turned in, the class can then formulate comprehensive answers with the teacher asking leading questions to guide the discussion.

### **For Further Study**

The teacher may want to have students further research *The Little Prince*. The teacher can also have students look into Rachel Portman and her other works. Their findings can be shared with the class at the beginning of a later lesson.

## The Story of the Opera

A young pilot introduces himself to the audience. He explains how grown-ups never really understood him and that now, as an adult, he earns a living soaring through the sky. The stars sing to him as he glides through the air, but, despite the pleasant atmosphere, he suddenly loses control of his plane and crashes into the Sahara Desert.

The pilot looks over the damage and begins to try and fix the plane. But just as he grabs his tools, he's interrupted by a small boy who curiously asks the pilot to draw a sheep. Though confused at first, the pilot comes to know the boy as "the Little Prince," and, slowly, the prince reveals his unusual story.

We learn the prince was once the proud owner of a tiny asteroid, where he cared for a lovely rose whom he adored but who was also very difficult to please. She challenged him to leave his home and gain more wisdom in order to be able to take care of her better, and so... he set out to visit some neighboring planets. During his travels he met several strange adults, including a king, a vain man, a drunkard, a businessman, and a lamplighter. After meeting these men, the Little Prince—not quite satisfied with what he'd discovered so far—decided to journey to planet Earth.

The prince continues his story while the pilot listens. On Earth, the prince says, he met a slithering snake who claimed that his deadly poison could "ease" all the prince's worries. The Little Prince then encountered a garden full of roses and cried at the thought that his own rose might merely be one out of a million other common flowers.

The prince resumes his tale. Soon after meeting the roses, he adds, he was comforted by a friendly fox. The fox, who begged the prince to tame her and make her his own, gently explained that everything worthwhile is invisible and that such things cannot be touched, but can only be felt with the heart. She also told him that the bonds of love are what make all things—including ordinary flowers—uniquely special.

The pilot then cuts off the prince's story, saying that the two of them will need water if they are to continue to survive in the desert. Exhausted, they travel to a spot directly beneath the prince's planet (which sits high in the night sky) and discover a well. As they collect cool water from the crystal-clear well, the pilot realizes his friendly affection for the prince and begins to understand the fox's message.

Still, the prince longs to return to his rose as he has promised. Will the tired and weary Little Prince make it home? Will the pilot be able to keep the prince's lessons in his heart if the Little Prince disappears?

## Our Composer, Rachel Portman

Born in West Sussex, Rachel began composing at the age of 14 and read music at the University of Oxford, where she became interested in writing music for student films and theatre productions. She gained experience writing music for drama in BBC and Channel 4 films, including ORANGES ARE NOT THE ONLY FRUIT, Mike Leigh's FOUR DAYS IN JULY, and Jim Henson's STORYTELLER series.

Rachel recently completed THE RETURN and also, WE WERE THE LUCKY ONES for Hulu which she co-composed with Jon Ehrlich.

Rachel became the first female composer to win an Academy Award, which she received for the score of EMMA. She was also the first female composer to win an Emmy Award, which she received for the film BESSIE. In 2023 she received her second Emmy for JULIA. She has received two further Academy Nominations for THE CIDER HOUSE RULES and CHOCOLAT, which also earned her a Golden Globe Nomination.

She has scored over a hundred films including THE DUCHESS, CHOCOLAT, OLIVER TWIST, ONE DAY, BELOVED, MANCHURIAN CANDIDATE, EMMA, A DOG'S PURPOSE, THE VOW, RACE, DOLPHIN TALE 2, DESPITE THE FALLING SNOW, GODMOTHERED, BELLE, THE RETURN, LIFE IS SWEET, HART'S WAR, ONLY YOU, THEIR FINEST, THE LEGEND OF BAGGER VANCE, BENNY AND JOON, NEVER LET ME GO, BEL AMI, RATCATCHER, GREY GARDENS, SNOW FLOWER AND THE SECRET FAN, THE LAKE HOUSE, BESSIE SMOKE, INFAMOUS, MONA LISA SMILE, PALOOKAVILLE, WAR OF THE BUTTONS, THE HUMAN STAIN and THE CIDER HOUSE RULES.

Rachel has also written an opera by Saint Exupery's, THE LITTLE PRINCE for Houston Grand Opera as well as several concert and stage commissions including a musical of LITTLE HOUSE ON THE PRAIRIE.

For the BBC PROMS she wrote THE WATER DIVINER, a dramatic choral symphony. She also wrote ENDANGERED performed at the National Centre for the Performing Arts, Beijing, EARTH SONG for the BBC Singers, and for Joyce Di Donato, THE FIRST MORNING OF THE WORLD as part of her EDEN programme. Other recent works include TIPPING POINTS, a violin concerto performed by Niklas Leipe with WDR Orchestra Germany/Noorlands Operan, Sweden.

Rachel has released two piano albums - ASK THE RIVER (2020) and BEYOND THE SCREEN (2023) the latter which features some of her most cherished film music for solo piano and cello. Given an OBE in 2010, Rachel is an honorary fellow of Worcester College, Oxford, and a Fellow of the Royal College of Music.
